SC to hear plea against Sterile plant closure



New Delhi: The Supreme Court will commence hearing on a plea of the Vedanta group against the closure of its Sterile copper unit in Tamil Nadu's Tuticorin. A Bench comprising Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud and justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra asked the parties to circulate short notes of their respective submissions in the case.

HFCL bags backhauling solutions order from BSNL

Mumbai: HFCL Ltd's shares rose after the company reported bagging an order worth ₹141 crore from BSNL for backhauling solutions. The firm said the deal is HFCL's commitment as the first 'Made in India' provider of backhauling solutions for mobile networks utilising unlicensed band radio (UBR) technology. HFCL will supply UBRs operating in the 5GHz frequency band with 1Gbps capacity.

Haryana police use tear gas shells to stop farmers' march

PARTIAL RESOLUTION. Govt agrees to drop cases filed against farmers during the 2020-2021 agitation, proposes committee for remaining demands

The Haryana Police lobbed several rounds of tear gas shells, including through drones, at Punjab-Haryana borders near Ambala and Jind to prevent farmers from reaching Delhi as thousands of farmers started from different parts of Punjab in their tractors as part of a call by farmers' body Samyukt Kisan Morcha (non-political). The farmers' body has raised several demands, including legal guarantee on the minimum support price (MSP).

A drone was also used to drop tear gas shells and keep an eye on the protesters, PTI reports. Farmers were seen carrying wet jute bags to shield themselves from the effect of the smoke released from tear gas shells, the report said.

After talks ended with the two Central ministers last night, SKM (non-political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha representatives had said that the Centre has refused to accept their demands, Union Agriculture Minister Arjun Munda, said that a consensus was reached on most issues and a formula was proposed for

resolving some others through the formation of a committee.

Sources in SKM (non-political) said that during the talks the government only agreed to withdraw cases against farmers filed during the 2020-2021 agitation and for the remaining demands, it wanted to set up another committee.

"What is the meaning of agreeing to the only demand which was a promise made in 2021 and yet to be fulfilled. The government is not sincere as it was informed well in advance about the proposed march to Delhi and the offer of talk came very late, still farmer leaders agreed," said a leader of SKM (non-political).

CENTRE STALEMATE

He also questioned the panel set up by the government and wanted to know the outcome, so far and alleged that it was a waste of money as the Doubling Farmers Income committee has elaborate recommendations. The panel should have focussed "only and only on legal MSP", he said.

The Sanjay Aggarwal-headed panel on MSP was established in July 2022, eight months after the government repealed the three contentious

farm laws and recently the government informed that the committee has held 37 meetings and workshops across the country. However, it has failed to submit even an interim report, a farmer leader pointed out.

Referring to the deadlock with the Centre over their demands, farmer leader Sarwan Singh Pandher, said, that they did not want a new committee concerning their demands as agreeing to any such committee would mean putting the issue on the back burner. Meanwhile, speaking during Bharat

the traffic situation, "we will adjust," a Bench comprising the CJ and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra told lawyers. Even as all major farmer bodies of Uttar Pradesh have expressed their disassociation from the "march to Delhi" call, the security curbs with barricades on the Noida-Delhi border and the Ghaziabad-Delhi border have surprised commuters who could not find any farmers on the road. Last week, too, during the farmer's protest in Noida, curbs by traffic police led to the complete closure of Noida Greater-Noida expressway and a resultant chaos, even as less than ten farmers with tractors were spotted under Mahamaya flyover around 4-5 pm.

Delhi Police has sealed three borders of Delhi - Singhu, Tikri and Ghazipur - and put up multiple layers of barricades at various roads leading to the Parliament and the central part of Delhi.

Besides, some entry and exit gates of select metro stations in central Delhi have been shut as a precautionary measure. The government has also closed Red Fort complex for visitors due to security reasons as during the farmers' protest in

2021, there were clashes with police at Red Fort.

TIGHTENED SECURITY
The Rajasthan government has tightened security checks along its borders with Haryana and Punjab and has also suspended mobile internet in three districts, mainly to prevent WhatsApp forwards, officials in Jaipur said.

Action on two separate petitions filed before it on the issue of farmers' march to Delhi, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has issued notices to the Centre and both Haryana and Punjab governments. While one petitioner has sought directions from the court to order the removal of all obstructions on the highways, another has pleaded for punishment for protesters for blocking highways. In a sudden turn of events, the SKM (Non-Political) received support from the other faction of SKM, which wrote a letter to the Prime Minister condemning the Haryana government's action on the protesting farmers. It has also appealed for support from SKM (Non-Political) for the February 16 Gramin Bharat Bandh, mainly called by Left-leaning trade unions.

HC issues notices to Haryana, Punjab, Centre

The Punjab and Haryana High Court issued notices to the Centre and the States of Haryana and Punjab, on two separate petitions filed about the farmers' Delhi Chalo march. One of the petitioners has sought directions from the court to stay all "obstructive" actions by the governments of Haryana and Punjab and the Union government against the farmers' protest. At the same time, the other has pleaded for directions to ensure no highway is blocked by the protesters and those who do so are punished.

The petitions came up for hearing before a bench of Acting Chief Justice GS Sandhawalia and Justice Lapita Banerji. Speaking to reporters after the hearing, Additional Solicitor General of India Satya Pal Jain, who was representing the Centre, said the court has issued notices and fixed February 15 as the next date for the hearing. The government is ready for talks with the representatives of farmers on any issue, said Jain.

Go green with near-normal project costs

Going green is no longer a prohibitively expensive affair. It pays to build a project, conforming to the norms prescribed by the Indian Green Building Council (IGBC). Contrary to misconceptions, factoring in the green norms doesn't result in the cost escalation of a real-estate project. From about 18 per cent in the early 2000s, the additional cost to meet the Green-rating requirements has come down to 2-5 per cent, depending on the size and nature of the project.

Citing the example of the GBC building itself, he said that the cost of construction went up by 18 per cent in 2003, to meet the green standards and get a platinum rating in 2003 for the 20,000-sq ft building. This came down to just 1.7 per cent in 2001,

when 15.18 sq ft from Indospace Logistics Parks, Luhari (Haryana), targeted to get the same rating. "Besides, the payback time has come down to three years from seven years," C Shekar Reddy, Chairman of IGBC (Hyderabad), told *businessline*.

"The best part is, the project, will reap benefits as the green elements incorporated will pay back through reduced operational costs, including a fall in energy spend. There are intangible benefits too. A green building with nice ventilation can reduce ab-

senteism," he said. The idea of going green with buildings has caught the attention of the people. From nowhere in 2003, when the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) set up the GBC to promote sustainability in the construction sector, the movement has reached a stage where 11 billion sq ft of space is green rated with 12,688 projects embracing the movement. Though started with a limited focus in the initial stages, the GBC has expanded the bouquet and started rating a variety of projects - residential, commercial, industrial areas, townships, railway stations, mass rapid transport systems, villages and landscapes, to make the movement broad based.

SAVINGS
"The green building movement could save 8.71 billion units of power a year,

as 10 million urban homes are IGBC-certified. It could save 26.7 billion litres of water a year. To put it in context, it is equal to the water required by a city like Hyderabad for a month," he said. The green-rated buildings could reduce carbon dioxide emissions aggregating 8.1 million tonnes a year, which is equivalent to taking 9.1 million cars off the road.

Shekar Reddy, who is also the Chairman of CII (Telangana), said that green-certified buildings make up about 80 per cent of the occupants and are thermally comfortable due to good design and proper operation of the facilities. "About 72 per cent of occupants are happy with the overall lighting levels. About 89 per cent occupants are happy with the visual environment and do not have a problem with glare," he said.

Kalyani Group to invest ₹26,000 crore in Odisha

Kalyani Steel has proposed to invest ₹26,000 crore to set up a titanium metal and aerospace components manufacturing and integrated advanced speciality steel and automotive components manufacturing complex at Gajamara in Odisha's Dhenkanal district, an official said.

SCR commissions third line between Karavadi-Suraredipalem stations with electrification

The South Central Railway (SCR) has commissioned the section between Karavadi-Suraredipalem for a distance of 20 km, as part of the Vijayawada-Gudur tripling and electrification project.

With the tripling of this stretch which falls under Prakasham District the entire stretch of 81 km between Bapatla-Suraredipalem will have a third line facility along with electrification.

Situated in the Grand Trunk route along the Coastal region of Andhra Pradesh, the section between Vijayawada-Gudur on SCR plays a vital role in connecting the northern and eastern parts of the country with the southern States.

This route has become highly congested with the steady increase in both passenger and freight trains.

To decongest this crucial section, the Vijayawada-Gudur third line project was sanctioned in the year 2015-16 for a distance of 288 km at an approximate cost of ₹3,246 crore.

The work is being executed by Rail Vikas Nigam Ltd. Works have been taken up simultaneously in all the stretches, according to a release.
